So we will mail it on Friday, which brings it to most members on Saturday. One of the features of the Show will be the presentation of a special award to Jennie Borden, Hayseville School third-grader, who originated the idea of school children raising funds for re-gilding of the Capitol Pioneer statue. Twenty-three exhibitors will show 103 frames of their choicest stamps and the bourse will have booths for 17 dealers. The U S Postoffice will have a sales office with all current U S stamps available for sale. The Club's cacheted cover will be sold for \$1.00 each or 4 for \$3.00.
