There is a resurgence of interest in collecting revenue stamps due in part to the quality and artistry of the early designs and also to the reasonable prices for them.

April 2024 Meeting.



<u>Success for a Young Exhibitor at the</u> <u>San Diego Stamp Show.</u>

A Mother, teenage brother and daughter took a Sunday afternoon to stop in at the San Diego Stamp Show last month. Yumika Ramirez had completed her stamp collecting Merit badge over a year ago at Scouting University - Point Loma College.

Her instructor, asked the class if anyone wanted to do an exhibit and she volunteered.



The effort took several zoom meetings and involved mentoring from both Phil Kumler and Niko Courtelis for the past year. Yumika, who is a team captain on her junior high school lacrosse team wanted her philatelic exhibit to be about sports. She also insisted on doing the exhibit in Spanish so her school friends could read and enjoy the exhibit.

The AAPE/WSP judge could not read or speak Spanish so she relied on her English Synopsis. Nevertheless Yumika earned a Silver-Bronze 55 points and is determined to improve her exhibit prior to its next showing at PIPEX.

Another highlight of the San Diego Show was an APS Town Hall meeting hosted



by CEO Scott English. The new StampED web outreach was announced and highlights a significant leadership paradigm shift towards education by the world's largest stamp collecting society.

He also stated that available venue rooms are quickly going away for those of us attending the Great American Stamp Show and that a stamp printed, gummed and perforated by Niko Courtelis in Portland was going to have its First Day of Issue ceremony at GASS.

Scott English will also make time to address USPS counterfeiting at GASS - so our resident expert is encouraged to either attend or do a presentation via zoom...

Doris McCarthy asked FIRST STAMPS to confirm that we will teach two more classes at the 2024 Scouting University in San Diego in August. It's a tough choice deciding whether to continue bringing up new collectors or attend GASS, but Yumika's younger brother has already asked if he can do an exhibit too, and will be applying for his seat in one of my August stamp collecting merit badge course.

Parents of the youngest youth buying stamps and seeing the exhibits allowed me to take a picture of his "want list."

Now that's 8 year old enthusiasm not often seen at major stamp shows.
